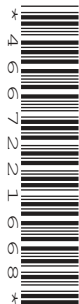

Production, location and change

- (a) Describe the main characteristics of the industrial estate shown in Fig. 1.1. [4]
- (b) Suggest how industrial estates such as that shown in Fig. 1.1 attempt to reduce their impact on the local environment. [6]
- 2** With reference to **one** country, assess the extent to which the management of agricultural change has been successful. [20]
- 3** 'Markets are the most important factor influencing the location of manufacturing and related service industry.'
- With reference to one or more examples, how far do you agree? [20]

Environmental management

- 4** Fig. 4.1 shows the types of energy resources used for electricity generation in selected countries in 2017.
- (a) Describe the variations in the types of energy resources used for electricity generation for the countries shown in Fig. 4.1. [4]
- (b) Suggest **two** reasons why the use of hydroelectric power (HEP) varies between countries. [6]
- 5** Evaluate the success of **one** named located scheme to produce electricity. [20]
- 6** How far do you agree that a global view is needed to solve problems of pollution? [20]

Global interdependence

- 7** Fig. 7.1 shows government debt as a percentage of gross domestic product (GDP) of LICs from 1970 to 2018.
- (a) Describe the trends shown in Fig. 7.1. [4]
- (b) Explain **two** causes of debt for countries. [6]
- 8** Assess the relative importance of factors affecting global inequalities in trade flows. [20]
- 9** 'The key to sustainable management of a tourist destination is learning from the past.'
- With reference to one or more examples, how far do you agree? [20]

- With reference to one or more examples, how far do you agree? [20]
- 12** With reference to **one** country, assess the extent to which physical factors cause regional disparities. [20]

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
