Section A: Education

Answer **either** Question 1 **or** Question 2.

- 1 (a) Explain the idea that schools operate in a way that reflects the organisation of the capitalist workplace. [9]
- (b) 'Rather than reducing gender divisions, schools contribute to the inequality between males and females.' Assess this view. [16]
- 2 (a) Explain the limitations of using IQ tests to measure intelligence in education. [9]
- (b) 'The reason why some minority ethnic groups have low levels of educational achievement is due more to their social class background than their ethnicity.' Assess this view. [16]

Section B: Global Development

Answer **either** Question 3 **or** Question 4.

- 3 (a) Explain why many cities in developing countries have a high rate of population growth. [9]
- (b) 'International aid is a barrier to economic growth in developing countries.' Assess this view. [16]
- 4 (a) Explain why democratic government may be important for economic development. [9]
- (b) 'Western models of economic growth are inappropriate for most developing countries.' Assess this view. [16]

Section C: Media

Answer **either** Question 5 **or** Question 6.

- 5 (a) Explain how the concept of hegemony has been used to understand the role of the media. [9]
- (b) 'The media have little influence in shaping the culture of society.' Assess this view. [16]
- 6 (a) Explain how the media may be used to challenge government power. [9]
- (b) 'The growth of the new media has weakened the power of large media corporations.' Assess this view. [16]

3**Section D: Religion**Answer **either** Question 7 **or** Question 8.

- 7** (a) Explain why there has been a growth in support for fundamentalist religious movements in recent decades. [9]
- (b) 'The power of religion to influence society has declined significantly in modern industrial societies.' Assess this view. [16]
- 8** (a) Explain how sects differ from churches. [9]
- (b) 'The growth of new religious movements is a response to the disenchantment that results from living in a routine and predictable world.' Assess this view. [16]

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
