Efficient markup and stylesheets must be used. All colour codes must be in hexadecimal.

- Create a new folder called **BB_html**
- Locate the following files and store them in your *BB_html* folder.

- 1 • Create a web page called **BB.htm**

This web page must work in all browsers and will have a table structure as shown below:

A 400 × 300	B 400 × 300	C 400 × 300
D 1200 × 250		
E 1200 × 150		
F 600 × 300	G 600 × 300	

- Each table cell is identified with a letter and all dimensions are in pixels. The letters and dimensions shown in the table must **not** appear on your final web page.
- The external table border must have a width of **4** pixels and all internal gridlines must have a width of **2** pixels. Table borders and gridlines must be visible.

- 2 • Place in cell A the image **brickwork.jpg**

- 3 • Place in cell B the text:
Click on an image for further details

- Set this text as style h2.

- 4 • Place in cell C the image **paving.jpg**
- Resize this image in the markup so that it is **394** pixels wide and maintains its aspect ratio.

- 5 • Place in cell D the image **BBlogo.jpg**

This is the logo of the company which appears on the company vehicles, letterheads, etc.

- Make this image a hyperlink to open the web page *BBcontact.htm* in a new browser window called **_new**

- 6 • Place in cell E the text from the file **BBtext1.txt**
 • Set this text as style h1. [2]
- 7 • Place in cell F the text from the file **BBtext2.txt**
 • Add your name, Centre number and candidate number to the end of this text.
 • Set the text *We will undertake building projects in other regions of the world.* as style h2.
 • Set the text *Web page design and creation by: Hothouse Design. Web page last edited by:* as style h3.
 • Make only the text *Hothouse Design* a hyperlink to the web page **<http://www.hothouse-design.co.uk>** which should be set to open in the same browser window. [3]
- 8 • Place in cell G the image of the map provided. [1]
- 9 • Make sure appropriate text is displayed if an image is not available. [1]
- 10 • Centre align the table in the browser. [1]
- 11 • Attach the stylesheet **BBstyle.css** to your web page and to **BBcontact.htm**
 • Save the web pages in your *BB_html* folder. [1]

*The stylesheet has been started but needs to be improved using the most efficient syntax. Make sure your stylesheet does **not** contain any html.*

- 12 • Open the stylesheet **BBstyle.css** in a suitable software package and examine its contents.
 • Edit this stylesheet so that it has the following specifications:

Styles h1, h2 and h3 display the font **Zapf Chancery**, if this is not available then **Blackadder ITC**, if neither of these fonts are available then display the default serif font.

Styles h1, h2 and h3 must be centre aligned text.

Style h1 must be red with no green or blue elements.

Style h2 must be blue with no green or red elements.

Style h3 must be blue with no green or red elements.

All borders and gridlines must be red with no green or blue elements and match the requirements of question 1.

- the address bar is visible.

- 14** • Identify the symbols used within spreadsheet formulae for the following mathematical operators:
- (a) Multiply
 - (b) Divide
 - (c) To the power of
 - (d) Is not equal to

- 15** • Open the files **j1831estimator.csv** and **j1831bricks.csv** in a spreadsheet package and examine the contents.
- Edit the file *j1831estimator.csv* so that it looks like this:

Take a screenshot showing cells A1 to C12 of your spreadsheet, including the row and column headings. Place this in your Evidence Document.

- 16** • Place your name, Centre number and candidate number in the centre of the header.
- Place an automated file name including the file path on the right in the footer.

For steps 17 to 20 you may enter test data to help you create your model.

- 17 • Restrict the data entry in cell B4 to **S** or **D** [2]

EVIDENCE 7

Take a screenshot of your method of restricting the data entry. Place this in your Evidence Document.

- 18 • Enter a formula in cell B10 to display:
 ○ **single** if cell B4 contains *S*
 ○ **double** if cell B4 contains *D* [4]

- 19 • Enter a function in cell B9 to lookup the name of the type of brick using the file *j1831bricks.csv* [5]

Some walls are single skin walls; these are one brick thick. Stronger walls are double skin; these are two bricks thick.

To calculate the number of bricks that will be required for a single skin wall, the following formula is used:

- *the length and height of the wall are multiplied together*
- *this is divided by the face area of each brick.*

Twice as many bricks are needed for a double skin wall.

For both double skin and single skin walls:

- *an extra 10% is always added as some bricks will be damaged*
- *an extra 50 bricks are added as some will need to be cut.*

- 20 • Enter a formula in cell B11 to calculate the number of bricks required for a wall. You can only buy whole bricks. [9]

- 21 • Save and print the spreadsheet showing the formulae. Make sure:
 ○ it is in landscape orientation
 ○ row and column headings are displayed
 ○ the contents of all cells are fully visible. [1]

PRINTOUT 1

Make sure that you have entered your **name**, **Centre number** and **candidate number** on your spreadsheet showing the formulae.

- 22 • Enter data to build a single skin wall with:
 ○ the brick code **V**
 ○ a length of **400** centimetres
 ○ a height of **60** centimetres. [1]

- 23 • Print the spreadsheet showing the values. Make sure the:
- printout fits on a single page
 - contents of all cells are fully visible.

Make sure that you have entered your **name**, **Centre number** and **candidate number** on your spreadsheet showing the values.

- 24 • Change the model so that the wall is double skin and its height is **50** centimetres.
- Print the spreadsheet showing the values. Make sure the:
 - printout fits on a single page
 - contents of all cells are fully visible.
